The Board, having considered the fee petition and supporting documentation, grants the fee petition in part. Enclosed with the fee petition was an itemized statement of services and corresponding fees. By order dated March 31, 2025, the Board granted the fee petition in part, the amount of \$887.50, with regard to the services performed in connection with Docket No. 18-1782.⁵ By letter dated April 3, 2025, counsel clarified that the remaining \$2,630.00 of the requested \$3,517.50 fee pertained to services performed in connection with Docket Nos. 14-0084, 16-0098, and 21-0235.
