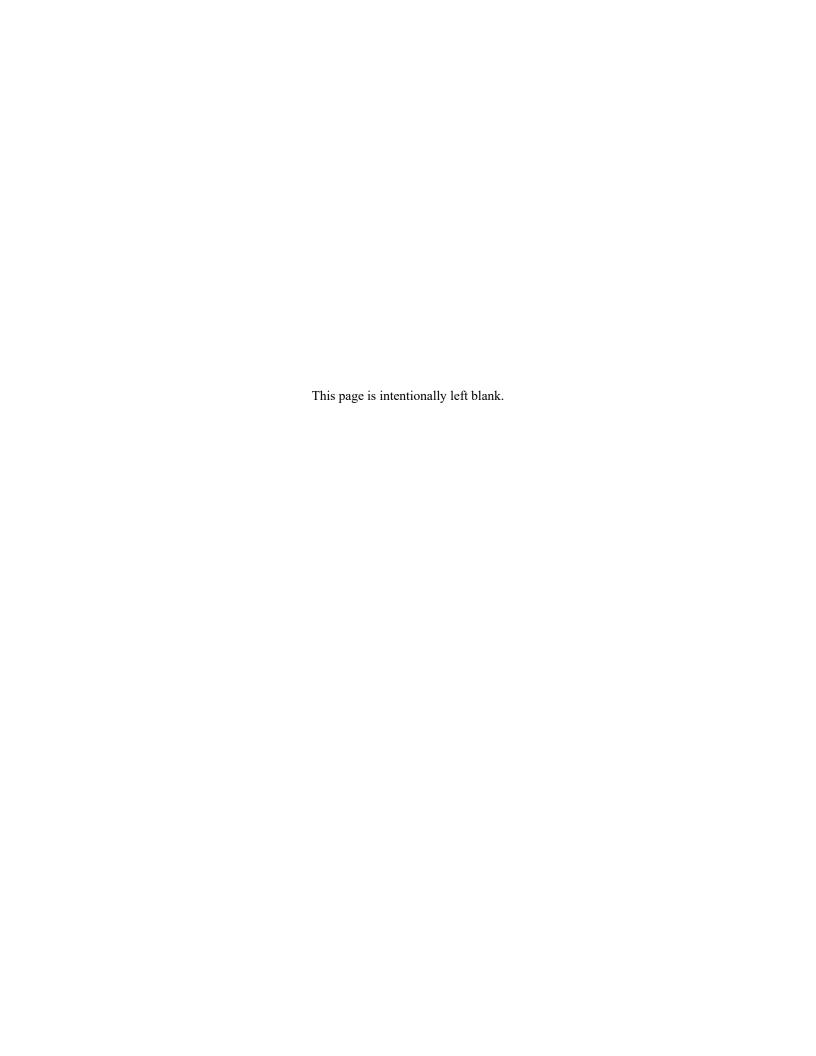
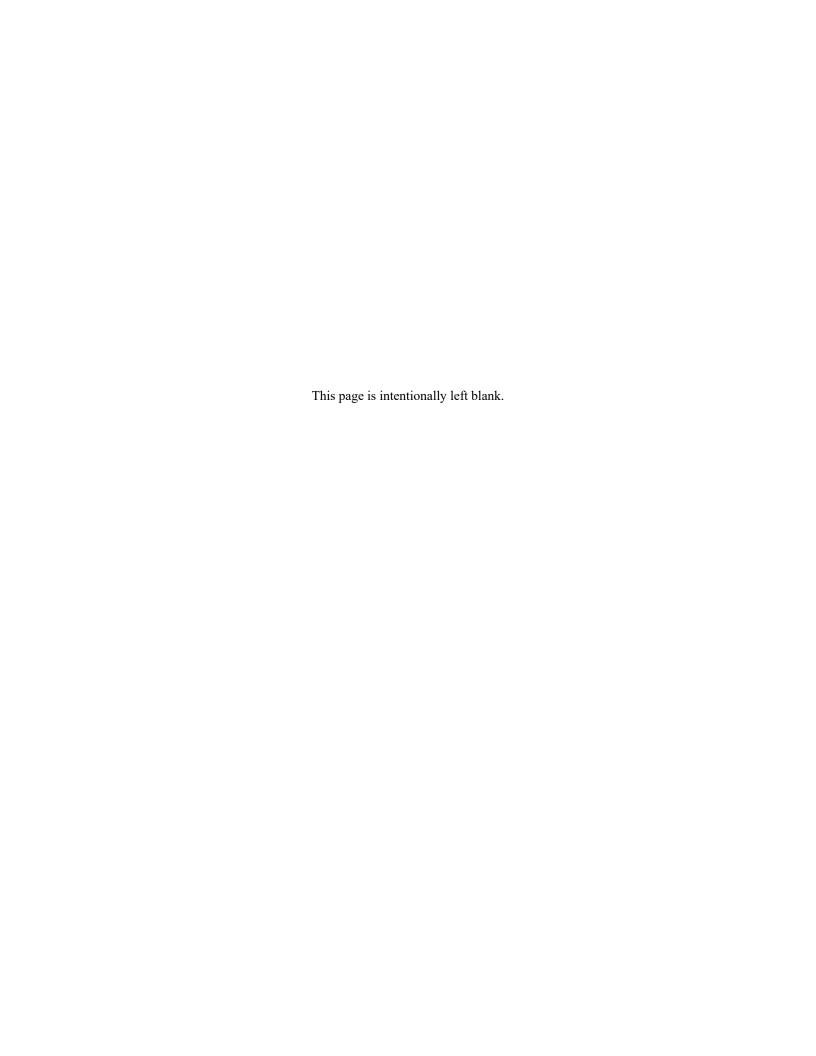

#### **Introduction**

The Community Service Employment for Older Americans (CSEOA) program, also known as the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP), aims to support the self-sufficiency and employment of older workers by providing part-time, paid community service positions and work-based training for unemployed, low-income individuals, age 55 or older.

SCSEP, as authorized by Title V of the Older Americans Act (OAA), has a dual purpose "to foster individual economic self-sufficiency and to increase the number of participants placed in unsubsidized employment in the public and private sectors, while maintaining the community service focus of the program." The OAA was amended by the Older Americans Act Reauthorization Act of 2016 (2016 OAA).

The FY 2026 Budget proposes to eliminate SCSEP.

#### **Funding Mechanism**

Under current law, SCSEP operates on a Program Year (PY) basis (April 1 to June 30 of the following year) and SCSEP funds are, in general, distributed by a statutorily prescribed formula which allocates funds to every state, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, based on U.S. Census data on the number of individuals in that jurisdiction who have low incomes and are age 55 and older. Prior to determining the amount available to be allocated to the states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, funds are reserved for the following: 1) up to 1.5 percent of the total authorization as determined by the Secretary of Labor for pilots, demonstrations, and evaluation projects; 2) a fixed percentage of 0.75 percent of the total allocation to the territories of Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and 3) a portion determined by the Secretary of Labor for national public or

non-profit agencies to serve eligible American Indian and Pacific Island/Asian American individuals.

After the reserved amounts are specified and the funding proportion for each state is determined by the formula, funds are allocated to and administered through grants to all state governors, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, and four territories, as well as national non-profit agencies. Approximately 22 percent of formula funds are awarded to the governors, with 78 percent competitively awarded to national nonprofit agencies for services across the country, which are renewed annually for four years, with an optional one-year extension.

#### **FY 2026**

The 2026 Budget eliminates the Community Service Employment for Older Americans program. This program does not have a strong record of success and is not cost-effective compared to other job training interventions. The goal of supporting the self-sufficiency and employment of older workers will be addressed through the Make America Skilled Again grant program, which will support the self-sufficiency and employment of all workers, including older workers.

#### **FY 2025**

Discretionary amounts shown for FY 2025 reflect the FY 2025 full-year Continuing Resolution amounts (P.L. 119-4).

DOL agencies will utilize funding provided through the full-year continuing resolution to realign agency operations with Administration priorities including, but not limited to, executing Executive Order 14158 titled *Establishing and Implementing the President's "Department of Government Efficiency"* (January 20, 2025); Executive Order 14210 titled *Implementing the President's "Department of Government Efficiency" Workforce Optimization Initiative* (February 11, 2025); Executive Order 14219 titled *Ensuring Lawful Governance and Implementing the President's "Department of Government Efficiency" Deregulatory Initiative* (February 19, 2025); Executive Order 14151 titled *Ending Radical And Wasteful Government DEI Programs And Preferencing* (January 20, 2025); and Executive Order 14278 titled *Preparing Americans for High-Paying Skilled Trade Jobs of the Future* (April 23, 2025). To the extent any of these Executive Orders are subject to an injunction, DOL will conduct any realignment activities consistent with such injunction(s).

#### **Workload and Performance Narrative**

In FY 2025, SCSEP grantees included 56 state and territorial government grantees and 19 competitively-selected national grantees. SCSEP-funded services are available in nearly all 3,000 U.S. counties and territories.

Under current law, grantees report employment outcomes to the Department on: 1) employment in the second quarter after exit; 2) employment in the fourth quarter after exit; and 3) median earnings of those employed in the second quarter after exit. Grantees also report SCSEP-specific measures such as community service level, and services to those most in need.
