# Capacity Building Subcommittee

## Subcommittee Focus Since October Meeting (Top 3 – 5 Emerging Recommendations)

The Capacity Building Subcommittee concentrated on:

- condensing the seven recommendations from the Interim Report
- identifying capacity building activities and content areas for each recommendation
- Responding to the Wage and Hour Division questions related to 14c and its affect on employment



**Recommendation 1**: CMS and RSA should encourage the development of state/local standards or adopt national standards of professional competence; and support broad scale professional development

- Require certifications for CIE professionals from a recognized accrediting body
- Train for all levels of staff as well as licensing/certification personnel
- Support innovative new CIE service models
- Provide training and TA to existing Center-based programs and staff for conversion to CIE



**Recommendation 1 (cont.)**: CMS and RSA should *encourage the* development of state/local standards or adopt national standards of professional competence; and support broad scale professional development

- Help states become familiar with DOJ settlements which stipulate changes in the delivery of services to decrease use of use of center based services and increase the availability of CIE
- Develop new tools and supports for assessing individual's capabilities and employment possibilities to strengthen the employment focus of a system led by CIE
- Research to establish contemporary evidence for what constitutes effective delivery of CIE
- Pilot employer driven models that enhance services and expand outcomes



**Recommendation 2**: Congress should direct CMS to expand the use of the HCBS Waiver program funds, now used for facility-based services, for CIE services, including improving the state match in order to provide an incentive for states to prioritize CIE outcomes.

- •fund CIE at a rate that is consistent and equitable across both VR and HCBS Waiver programs and at a rate that allows for the professional development identified under the first recommendation
- Allocation for individuals who receive HBCS Waiver funding for services will need to be dedicated for CIE to improve transition and employment outcomes



**Recommendation 3**: Identify common data collection points across federal agencies, using a clear definition for CIE, as well as establish systems to share data across programs and publically report employment outcomes.

- Adopt a common definition of CIE, derived from the WIOA definition
- Specify data collection points for both services and outcomes



**Recommendation 4**: Congress should direct the formation of an interagency team to develop an implementation plan for incorporating these capacity building steps for increasing CIE

- Federal interagency team to be charged with developing the implementation plan within a specified time frame
- •The implementation plan will be the framework for implementing the activities outlined under the previous Recommendations



Possible Areas of Recommendations that may overlap with other sub-committees

As an important next step, include a focus on plans for implementation of final Advisory Committee recommendations
