#### **Application Executive Summary**

This is an FFY 2020 Section 5311 CARES Act application in the amount of \$13,698,396. Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share. This application utilizes CARES Act funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. This grant will support New Hampshire's rural 5311 transit providers during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.

The apportioned CARES Act funds for the State of New Hampshire total is \$13,773,396 (see attached table 3).

The State of NH will be transferring \$80,000 in CARES Act funding to Vermont VAoT.

This will leave \$13,693,396 in available section 5311 Rural CARES Act funding for NHDOT to allocate. Of that total, 15% will be allocated to Intercity 5311 F in the amount of \$2,054,009 and 10% will be allocated to State Administrative funds in the amount of \$1,369,340.

This will leave a total of \$10,270,047 to support rural 5311 transit providers.

There will be 3 projects associated with this grant.

Project #1 - Rural in the amount of \$10,270,047

This project will support Operations for NH's existing Rural 5311 transit providers.

Project #2 - The grant will support Intercity agencies with 15% of the apportioned CARES Act funds in the amount of \$2,054,009. As Concord Coach Lines is the only current subrecipient of operating assistance, NHDOT will work with FTA in the coming months to determine how the remainder of the funding may be utilized, what formerly unsubsidized services are now eligible, etc. NHDOT will submit budget revisions for this project pending such information.

Project #3 - State Administrative funds, the NHDOT will utilize 10% of the apportioned CARES Act funds in the amount of \$1,369,340 to provide administrative and TA assistance to rural and intercity agency's impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.

Activities in this grant began on January 20, 2020 and will continue until spent. Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share and the activities in this application are not required to be programmed in the Long-Range Transportation Plan or Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

The Recipient agrees that if it receives Federal funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or through a pass-through entity through the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, a different Federal agency, or insurance proceeds for any portion of a project activity approved for FTA funding under this Grant Agreement, it will provide written notification to FTA, and reimburse FTA for any Federal share that duplicates funding provided by FEMA, another Federal agency, or an insurance company.

#### **Project Description**

The NHDOT has allocated 15% of the apportionment for the 5311 Rural CARES Act to support Intercity transit providers during the COVID-19 crisis in the amount of \$2,054,009. As Concord Coach Lines is currently the only subrecipient of 5311f funds in NH, NHDOT will need to work with FTA to determine eligibility of additional subrecipients. Pending confirmation of such information, it is anticipated that the balance of funding would be used to provide intercity service on corridors determined to be statewide priorities by the Statewide Strategic Transit Assessment (SSTA) study completed in January 2020.

#### **Project Benefits**

This project will benefit the three routes serviced by Concord Coach, Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the routes consisted of the following:

Berlin, NH to North Conway, NH - This project entails one southbound and one northbound trip per day between Berlin and North Conway, connecting to existing Concord, NH service to Boston's South Station and Logan Airport.

Littleton, NH to Concord, NH -This project entails one southbound and one northbound trip per day between Littleton, NH and Concord, NH.

North Conway, NH to Concord, NH - This project entails one southbound and one northbound trip per day between Memorial Day and Columbus Day, and then Fridays and Sundays only between Columbus and Memorial Days.

It is anticipated that additional funding would be utilized to ensure service provided by private, for-profit agencies prior to the COVID-19 pandemic could be re-started. Such services likely require "gap" funding, though eligibility and/or specific FTA program guidance needs to be formally vetted by NHDOT/FTA prior to any contractual arrangements.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, Concord Coach Lines operated three subsidized routes in NH: 1) Berlin, NH to North Conway, NH, 2) North Conway, NH to Concord, NH, and 3) Littleton, NH to Concord, NH. Services were designed to connect to unsubsidized connecting services from Concord, NH to Boston's South Station and Logan Airport. All Concord Coach Lines services have ceased as of March 28, 2020 due to COVID-19. NHDOT will work with Concord Coach Lines to best determine how to start services once again; likely in June 2020. The startup may require subsidized service between Concord, NH and Boston, MA given the crucial nature of that connection.

<u>Application Executive Summary:</u> This is an FFY 2020 Section 5311 CARES Act application in the amount of \$13,698,396. Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share. This application utilizes CARES Act funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. This grant will support New Hampshire's rural 5311 transit providers during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.

The apportioned CARES Act funds for the State of New Hampshire total is \$13,773,396 (see attached table 3).

The State of NH will be transferring \$80,000 in CARES Act funding to Vermont VAoT. This will leave \$13,693,396 in available section 5311 Rural CARES Act funding for NHDOT to allocate. Of that total, 15% will be allocated to Intercity 5311 F in the amount of \$2,054,009 and 10% will be allocated to State Administrative funds in the amount of \$1,369,340.

There will be 3 projects associated with this grant.

Project #1 - Rural in the amount of \$10,270,047 This project will support Operations for NH's existing Rural 5311 transit providers.

This will leave a total of \$10,270,047 to support rural 5311 transit providers.

Project #2 - The grant will support Intercity agencies with 15% of the apportioned CARES Act funds in the amount of \$2,054,009. As Concord Coach Lines is the only current subrecipient of operating assistance, NHDOT will work with FTA in the coming months to determine how the remainder of the funding may be utilized, what formerly unsubsidized services are now eligible, etc. NHDOT will submit budget revisions for this project pending such information.

Project #3 - State Administrative funds, the NHDOT will utilize 10% of the apportioned CARES Act funds in the amount of \$1,369,340 to provide administrative and TA assistance to rural and intercity agency's impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.

Activities in this grant began on January 20, 2020 and will continue until spent. Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share and the activities in this application are not required to be programmed in the Long-Range Transportation Plan or Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

The Recipient agrees that if it receives Federal funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or through a pass-through entity through the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, a different Federal agency, or insurance proceeds for any portion of a project activity approved for FTA funding under this Grant Agreement, it will provide written notification to FTA, and reimburse FTA for any Federal share that duplicates funding provided by FEMA, another Federal agency, or an insurance company.

NHDOT executed the FY 2020 Certifications and Assurances in TRAMS on 04/17/2020. The NHDOT is current with all Civil Rights Requirements and FTA annual certifications. All administrative and statutory requirements have been met in accordance with the §5311 Formula Grants for Rural Areas, as articulated in FTA Circular 9040.1G.
