Application Executive Summary

Colorado DOT (CDOT) was allocated \$39,754,866 FFY2020 FTA-5311 CARES Act funds and CDOT is distributing FTA-5311 CARES Act funds through a phased approach. This application is for the phase I distribution of \$27,727,987 (partial FFY2020 apportionment). Per the CARES Act, the grant requests 100% federal share. The funding is being utilized to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19.

This grant scope of work includes the following projects:

P1: Operating assistance, project administration for 37 rural transit agencies; and state/program administration for CDOT to administer the 5311 CARES Act program (9.81% of apportionment). P2: ICB Operating assistance, project admin, preventive maintenance and vehicle rebuild (15% of apportionment).

The remaining CARES Act funds of \$12,026,879 is in the process of Phase II distribution, CDOT will amend the application to add the third project at a later date.

Details are included in the Program of Projects (POP) in the application documents.
