Project Description

Standing Rock Public Transit/Sitting Bull College is proposing the following expansion at the existing transit facility: 1) 1,500 square foot bus port shelter, 2) 240 square foot storage shed to replace an existing shed in the same location, 3) 112 square foot ADA entry vestibule at the front of the existing building and, 4) 1,050 square foot concrete parking pad on the east side of the existing building.

The useful life of buildings and most other facilities (concrete, steel, and frame construction) is 40 years. Any equipment exceeding \$5,000 per unit and useful life greater than 1 year, and any supplies with an aggregate value greater than \$5,000, will be reported as project property at closeout of this award. Federal share is 100%.

Project Benefits

The proposed projects will benefit the program by:

- 1) The construction of a bus port shelter will allow the transit program to increase the useful life of the transit fleet. The existing transit maintenance facility can only provide shelter for 50% of the fleet.
- 2) A storage shed will allow the transit program to increase the useful life of the grounds keeping equipment, i.e. mower, tractor and tools, as well as provide much need storage space for tires and bus parts.
- 3) The vestibule will provide safe accessibility for passengers going to and from the transit facility waiting area. The vestibule is also necessary to separate the waiting room from direct outdoor temperatures.
- 4) An expanded parking lot for employees and customers will significantly improve the safety of passengers. The current parking area is a small space situated directly in front of the transit facility where passenger transfers to and from other buses and the facility waiting room take place. A new parking space will be constructed on the side of the transit center and the current parking lot will be designated specifically for passenger transfers.

The Title VI equity analysis must compare the equity impacts of various siting alternatives, and the analysis must occur before the selection of the preferred site.
- b. When evaluating locations of facilities, recipients should give attention to other facilities with similar impacts in the area to determine if any cumulative adverse impacts might result. Analysis should be done at the Census tract or block group where appropriate to ensure that proper perspective is given to localized impacts.
- c. If the recipient determines that the location of the project will result in a disparate impact on the basis of race, color, or national origin, the recipient may only locate the project in that location if there is a substantial legitimate justification for locating the project there, and where there are no alternative locations that would have a less disparate impact on the basis of race, color, or national origin.
