Application Executive Summary

Amendment #1

The MaineDOT is requesting to amend ME-2020-027-00 to move \$10,000 in Federal Admin and \$13,923 in Federal Operating funds (total of \$23,923) to Federal Capital to use toward the vehicle purchase of a 12X2 cutaway for MaineDOT sub-recipient, West's Transportation Inc.

The total cost of the expansion vehicle is \$53,301. In addition to this amendment MaineDOT will amend ME-2019-019-01 (\$18,717 in federal and \$4,680 in local funds) to complete the procurement.
