Amendment #2 (6/1/23): This application is to request FFY 2021 Section 5311 Rural formula funds apportioned to the state of Minnesota in the amount of \$3,302,463 for to increase funding Project #2 funding for transit operating expenses from January 1, 2024 - December 31, 2024, and to increase associated Project #2 State Program administrative expenses. The State of Minnesota will provide \$2, 580,177 of Greater Minnesota Transit Assistance and General Funds to match federal Rural Operating. Additional local matching funds of approximately \$418,643 will be provided by Cedar Valley Services and Three Rivers Community Action. Two additional line items will be added to Project #2 to add milestones which will extend the period of performance for these activities.
