Application Executive Summary

AMENDMENT #2:

The 2nd amendment to grant WI-2018-045 reallocates unspent FFY 2018 Section 5311 funds to capital projects approved in CYs 2022-2023. Section 5311 funds allocated to operating projects are reduced from \$10,194,488 to \$8,972,000; Section 5311 funds allocated to capital cost of contracting projects are reduced from \$2,699,748 to \$2,699,479; and Section 5311 funds allocated to intercity bus projects are reduced from \$2,485,611 to \$2,412,355.

Newly funded capital projects include ten replacement <30-foot buses, one replacement van, one shop compressor, one shop fuel pump, one shop renovation, two desktop computers, a set of driver tablets, and three bus bicycle racks.

Amendment documents include a revised POP, an Excel file detailing the vehicles being replaced through this amendment, WisDOT's FTA-approved November 2022 and April 2023 STIP amendments, and a letter detailing Wisconsin's CY 2019 federally funded intercity bus service (ICB) expenses. These expenses exceeded 15% of Wisconsin's FFY 2018 Section 5311 apportionment, and were paid using a combination of FFY 2017 and FFY 2018 apportionment funds.

No new funds are being added to this award. The period of performance for the grant remains 3/30/2025 with this amendment.

In executing this grant, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) agrees to abide by Section 3011 of the FAST Act (49 U.S.C. 5323(j)(2)(C) regarding the phased increase in domestic content under the Buy America statute for rolling stock. As Grant Agreement includes an FTA-funded transit vehicle purchase, WisDOT agrees to comply with the related requirements set forth in 49 CFR 26.49(a). Specifically, WisDOT must ensure as a condition of being authorized to bid or propose on FTA-assisted transit vehicle procurements, that each transit vehicle manufacturer certified that it complied with DOT requirements for submitting a DBE program and goal to FTA prior to bidding. WisDOT is also required to submit the name of the successful bidder and the total dollar value of the contract within 30 days of making a FTA- assisted transit vehicle award using the required FTA reporting tool. WisDOT understands that failure to comply with these requirements may result in formal enforcement action or appropriate sanction as determined by FTA, including reimbursement of FTA funds used for the vehicle procurement.

In addition to FTA's Buy America requirements under 49 U.S.C. 5323(j) and 49 CFR Part 661, which require that the steel, iron, and manufactured goods used in an FTA-funded project are produced in the United States, the Build America, Buy America Act (BABA) (Public Law 117-58, div. G 70914(a)) now requires that construction materials used in infrastructure projects are also produced in the United States. Refer to terms and conditions in FTAs Master Agreement, Section 15. The BABA requirements for construction materials applies to this grant, in addition to the Buy America requirements, except to the extent a waiver of either requirements may apply.

AMENDMENT #1:

This grant funded WisDOTs 2018 Rural Transit Assistance program utilizing 5311, 5307, and CMAQ funds for rural transit operations, JARC, and intercity bus projects statewide. After the completion and reconciliation of our Calendar Year 2018 projects, WisDOT is now re-programming unspent capital cost of

contracting, mobility management, and operating assistance funds to fund eligible projects under the same funding programs.

FY18 5311 Rural Formula funds: The capital cost of contracting total is decreased by \$191,419 (now \$2, 699,748), and the Intercity Bus Program total is decreased by \$218,569 (now \$2,485,611). These cost savings will be used for a vehicle replacement project that was added for Dunn County (\$72,462) and an additional \$337,526 for the operating assistance budget (now \$10,195,488) to fund 2020 projects in Manitowoc, Menominee Tribe, and Stevens Point. The period of performance for operating projects is now extended to 12/31/2022 to account for financial audits for 2020 projects.

FY18 5307 Urban Formula funds: This amendment will reflect actual 5307-JARC program reimbursements of \$200,000 in FFY 2018 Section 5307 funds as part of the Governor's Apportionment. The budget for 5307-JARC Operating Assistance is adjusted down by \$8,719 (now \$27,335). The budget for 5307-JARC Mobility Management is adjusted up by the same amount (now \$172,665). No change to the period of performance, no funds are being added or de-obligated.

CMAQ: \$453,726 in 5307 and \$46,274 in 5311 funds were originally awarded through the CMAQ process, and then transferred from FHWA to FTA.

This amendment will reflect actual CMAQ-JARC program reimbursements.

The 5307-CMAQ-JARC budget for Operating Assistance is adjusted down by \$17,707 (now \$360,191). The 5307-CMAQ-JARC budget for Mobility Management is adjusted up by \$16,012 (now \$91,840). (Difference of \$1,695 will be de-obligated).

The 5311-CMAQ-JARC budget for Mobility Management is adjusted down by \$3,241 (now \$41,256). The 5311-CMAQ-JARC budget for Operating Assistance is adjusted up by \$3,206 (now \$4,983). (Difference of \$35 will be de-obligated).

WisDOT is de-obligating a total of \$1,730 in CMAQ funds (\$1,695 of 5307/CMAQ, \$35 of 5311/CMAQ). No change to the period of performance

No new funds are being added to this award. The period of performance for the grant is extended to 12/ 31/2022 with this amendment.

Local funds used as match for federal assistance include: local tax levy, and state operating assistance funds for municipal transit; private contributions and in-kind match for intercity bus projects.

Attached documents include STIP and STIP amendment approval letters, the Program of Projects, and labor union information and warranty letter.

WisDOT is applying for assistance via FFY 2018 FTA Section 5311 for Department projects and 48 agencies statewide. WisDOT is requesting these funds (\$16,664,130) for rural transit operating (\$9,856, 962) and capital cost of contracting (\$2,891,167) assistance, intercity bus capital cost of contracting (\$2, 704,180), JARC (\$750,000), and Admin (\$461,821) projects.

WisDOT is also applying for \$200,000 in FFY 2018 Section 5307 funds as part of the Governor's Apportionment for JARC projects in urbanized areas.

WisDOT is also applying for \$453,726 in 5307 and \$46,274 in 5311 funds that were originally awarded through the CMAQ process, and then transferred from FHWA to FTA.

In total, WisDOT is applying for \$17,364,130 in Section 5307 (\$653,726) and 5311 (\$16,710,404) funds.

Local funds used as match for federal assistance include: local tax levy, and state operating assistance funds for municipal transit; private contributions and in-kind match for intercity bus projects.

Award Description

Purpose

The second amendment to grant WI-2018-045 reprograms remaining unspent funds from Wisconsin's FFY 2018 FTA Section 5311 apportionment for subrecipient capital projects approved by WisDOT in CYs 2022

and 2023.

Activities to be performed:

At this time, activities previously funded through Wisconsin's FFY 2018 FTA Section 5311 apportionment have been completed. In the second amendment to grant WI-2018-045, remaining funds will be distributed to two rural public transit agencies for a variety of capital investments. These include acquisitions of replacement <30-foot buses, a replacement van, a shop compressor & fuel pump, desktop computers, a set of driver tablets, and bus bicycle racks, plus modest renovations to one existing shop.

Expected outcomes:

Funds reprogrammed through the second amendment to grant WI-2018-045 will help rural transit agencies sustain their services, by 1) providing replacement rolling stock for several revenue vehicles that are well beyond useful life benchmarks and costly to maintain in a state of good repair, 2) providing equipment that will improve one agency's capacity to transport bicyclists and its transit service management & operations, 3) improving one agency's bus repair capabilities and preserving the investments of local and federal funds in its facility.

Intended beneficiaries:

While the transit agencies receiving capital project funds through the second amendment to grant WI-2018-045 will directly benefit from the funds, Wisconsins rural area residents are the ultimate intended beneficiaries. The funded capital projects will provide more reliable, comfortable, and structurally sound vehicles; will put bike racks on more buses; and will facilitate more timely and effective maintenance and repair of rolling stock.

Subrecipient Activities:

The second amendment to grant WI-2018-045 will fund replacement <30-foot buses for the City of Manitowoc and the Sawyer County-Lac Courte Oreilles Transit Commission (dba Namekagon Transit); a replacement van for the City of Manitowoc; a replacement shop compressor, fuel pump, and shop renovation for the City of Manitowoc; and desktop computers, a set of driver tablets, and bus bicycle racks for Namekagon Transit.

AMENDMENT 1

This amendment reprograms unspent operating funds from 2019 (now \$10,187,836) to cover some 2020 operating projects and re-programs unspent capital cost of contracting costs into operating and a vehicle replacement project (\$72,462 for Dunn County). This amendment extends the period of performance for operating, capital cost of contracting to 12/31/22 to account for financial audit reconciliation activities and COVID-19/CARES act impacts.

ORIGINAL

\$16,664,130 of FFY 2018 5311 funds for operating (\$9,856,962) and capital cost of contracting (\$2,891, 167) for calendar year 2018 (rural bus and taxi services) and operating (\$895,819) and capital cost of contracting (\$1,808,361) for calendar year 2019 (intercity bus). This project also includes \$750,000 in funding for job access projects (\$648,323 for Mobility Management and \$101,677 for Operating assistance), as well as \$461,821 for state program administration.
