The Reservation encompasses approximately 45,000 acres of land, with most of the Reservation in California and a small portion in Arizona. The Reservation is in a region characterized by its arid climate, with temperatures reaching well above 100 degrees Fahrenheit during the summer months. The Quechan Indian Tribe has a rich cultural history that dates back thousands of years. The Tribe has traditionally relied on the Colorado River for its livelihood, using its waters for irrigation, fishing, and transportation. Today, the Tribe operates various businesses on the Reservation, including a casino, a resort, and a museum, which provides employment opportunities for Tribal members. The Fort Yuma Indian Reservation is home to several important historical sites, including the Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area, commemorating the region's role in the United States' westward expansion. The Reservation is also home to the Quechan Tribal Museum, which houses an extensive collection of artifacts and exhibits that showcase the Tribe's rich cultural heritage.
