Construction of a new Multi-Modal Transportation Center on Taylor Street in Montpelier. The newly constructed center will become the City's transportation hub for local and regional mass transit services through Green Mountain Transit (GMT). GMT will staff and operate the transportation facility under a lease agreement with the City. The floors above grade will be utilized for 30 housing units developed and operated under a condominium agreement with Housing Vermont and Downstreet Housing. The transit

center will also serve as a connection point for a shared use path through the city. The shared use path includes installation of a new pedestrian bridge over the North Branch of the Winooski River allowing pedestrians and cyclists to cross the river and connects two links of existing paths.

#### \*\*\*ORIGINAL GRANT\*\*\*

Construction of a Multi-Modal Transportation Center with terminal and related site work. Construction of a shared use path which includes a pedestrian bridge over the North Branch of the Winooski. Demolition of two existing buildings at 10 and 12 Main Street to allow construction of an improved access road for vehicles and safe passage for those using the shared use path.

The City of Montpelier is committed to ensuring that all of its building facilities and programs are accessible. To this end, the One Taylor Street Transit Center will be fully accessible to people with disabilities both physically and programmatic. All transitions in and around the building will be fully accessible. All bathroom facilities have been designed to be fully compliant with ADA requirements. The City of Montpelier recently completed and adopted its ADA Transition plan with the help of the Institute for Human Centered Design. The housing portion of the project (No FTA funding) will be fully accessible and the elevator serving the housing will also be in full compliance.

The Transit Center was designed to have a seamless transition between the driveway of the transit center, the sidewalk, and the road surface. Each defined area will be demarcated by a change in materials. Pavers and stamped concrete in the drive, concrete on the sidewalk and asphalt in the road will keep the different modes of transportation separated yet will still allow for ease of access for people with disabilities or limited mobility.

The pavers and sidewalk will connect to the shared use path on the southern side of the site adjacent to the easterly side of the Taylor Street Bridge.

Additionally, the City of Montpelier is reconstructing Taylor Street proper and installing sidewalks on both sides of the street, street trees with storm water mitigation cells, relocating utilities, and providing a safe and accessible link between State Street and the new Transit Center. Currently, there is no accessible route from State Street to the shared use path and the "Taylor Street Reconstruction" project (funded primarily through a combination of State and Local funding will be completed concurrently with the Transit Center. No federal funds are being accessed for this portion of the project.

Taylor Street is a key street in the downtown network for pedestrians and bicyclists. It is one block from the state capitol and the center of the downtown. Taylor Street is also a major entrance to the Montpelier shared-use path. The design option for Taylor Street provides sidewalks along both sides of the street connecting to the transit center and the shared-use path, separated from the street by street trees and rain gardens. The travel lanes will be marked with sharrows to indicate that this street is also a bikeway.

Therefore, the design option retains the driveways, but the sidewalk would remain at its elevated grade going across the driveways, rather than ramping down to the driveway level. This design is safer for pedestrians, as the sidewalk remains level and drivers sense that they are crossing a sidewalk and must slow down and proceed with caution. A trailhead with wayfinding signs, benches, and landscaping is at the entry to the Montpelier shared-use path to help visitors and path users navigate downtown Montpelier and destinations along the path.

Specifically, the City must comply with the ADA Standards for Transportation Facilities when constructing the multi-modal transportation center on Taylor Street in Montpelier. The following is a non-exhaustive list of ADA standards that the City must comply with and document compliance of:

- As required under DOT ADA Standard 206.4.1, the City must ensure that 60 percent of all public entrances to the facility will be accessible. If a station has only two entrances, then both must be accessible.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.10, for rail projects, the City must ensure that no flange way gap can be greater than 2.5" where passenger circulation paths cross tracks at grade (i.e. a street-level pedestrian crossing over streetcar tracks).
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 206.3, the City must ensure that accessible routes coincide with or are located in the same area as general circulation paths, and elements such as ramps, elevators, and fare vending and collection areas are placed to minimize the distance that wheelchair users and other persons who cannot climb steps must travel in comparison to the general public.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 406.8, the City must ensure that curb ramps will have detectable warnings.
- As required under DOT ADA Standard 810.2, the City must ensure that bus boarding and alighting areas are in compliance with the ADA-ABA Guidelines (Section 810.2), which address surfaces (sturdy); dimensions (96" long x 60" wide); connection to sidewalks, streets, and pedestrian paths; slope (not steeper than 1:48); signs; and public address systems.
- As required by DOT ADA Standard 810.5.3, the City must ensure that station platforms must be coordinated with the vehicle floor height.
