This Statement of Reasons is in response to the complaint you filed with the Department of Labor on June 25, 2018, alleging that violations of Title IV of the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act (LMRDA) occurred in connection with the election of union officers conducted by Local 917, International Union of Operating Engineers, on August 26, 2017.

The Department conducted an investigation of your allegations. As a result of the investigation, the Department has concluded, with respect to the specific allegations, that there was no violation of the LMRDA that may have affected the outcome of the election.

You alleged that ballots were incorrectly tallied. You stated that there were concerns about the handling of the last bundle of ballots counted and that there were discrepancies in tallying that group of ballots. You alleged that candidates in the tally room were distracting the election committee members as they attempted to tally the ballots. You requested that the tally sheets be made public and that the ballots be recounted. Section 401(c) of the LMRDA requires a union to provide adequate safeguards to ensure a fair election.

The Department reviewed the election records and conducted a ballot recount. The Department recounted all of the stacks as bundled by the union and found minor differences in the count in two stacks for two races. In stack 12, the group of ballots about which you specifically complained, the Department counted 16 votes for you for president; the union had counted 17 votes for you. In stack 7, the Department counted 28 votes for you for president; the union had counted 29 votes for you. In stack 7, the union also counted 1 too many votes for [REDACTED], [REDACTED] candidate; the correct margin for that race was 96 rather than 97. In all of the other stacks and for all of the other races, the union count and the Department's recount matched. The differences in the count would not have affected the outcome of the election. The original tally and recount results for your two races are shown below:

There were no significant errors in the union's ballot tally in comparison to the Department's recount to suggest that the election committee grossly mishandled the tallying of the ballots.

The Department's investigation also confirmed that all ballots prepared were accounted for or retained in the union's records. The ballots were secured inside a briefcase, which was located inside a padlocked metal box with the key to the lock inside. The metal box had to be cut open; therefore, the ballots remained secured after the ballot tally. The outside of the metal box was also sealed with tape. The Department was able to reconcile the number of ballots printed, mailed, returned, and unused in the election.

In sum, the Department's investigation yielded only a few minor ballot count discrepancies that did not change the outcome of any race. There was no violation.

You also raised allegations in your complaint that had not been raised in your protest to the union. Section 402(a) of the LMRDA requires that a member exhaust the remedies available under the union's constitution and bylaws before filing a complaint with the Secretary of Labor. These allegations were not properly exhausted and were not investigated by the Department.

For the reasons set forth above, the Department of Labor concludes that there was no violation of the LMRDA that may have affected the outcome of the election. Accordingly, I have closed the file on this matter.
