This is in response to your continuing hardship exemption request for International Brotherhood of Boilermakers, Subordinate Lodge 592, LM File No. [REDACTED], for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2007. Your request dated February 4, 2008 was received by the Office of Labor-Management Standards (OLMS) on February 11, 2008. A continuing hardship exemption request requires the requesting union to demonstrate that it cannot file Form LM-2 electronically without undue burden or expense.
