What is REALifelines?

REALifelines is a new program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, military medical transition centers, and career workforce agencies located in hometowns across the country. The program, in its pilot phase, seeks to support the economic recover and reemployment of transitioning wounded and injured service members and their families by identifying barriers to employment or reemployment and addressing those needs. The program will link service members with local professionals in their hometown communities to support their economic recovery and reemployment through a range of services. As part of the program, wounded and injured service members, and their spouses, will be eligible for services offered at more than 3,500 One-Stop career centers the Department of Labor has set nationwide.
